MARK M. ELLIOTT, being duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

- 1. I reside at 2 Arborwood Lane, White Plains, New York 10603.
- 2. I have continually been a registered voter in the City of White Plains and enrolled in the Democratic Party since 1982, the first year I was eligible to so register.
- 3. I am currently Chair of the City of White Plains Board of Ethics and a member of the City of White Plains Judicial Screening Committee.
- 4. Annexed hereto as Exhibit A is a true and correct copy of an October 13, 2016 letter from Hon. Thomas M. Roach, Mayor of the City of White Plains, addressed to me at my aforementioned address in the City of White Plains, regarding my appointment to the Judicial Screening Committee.
- 5. I duly signed Democratic Party Designating Petitions designating Milagros Lecuona, Michael Kraver, Saad Turab Siddiqui, and Alan D. Goldman as candidates for the offices of Mayor of the City of White Plains and Members of the Common Council of the City of White Plains, respectively, and provided all other requisite information.
- 5. I understand that my signature on one or more such nominating petitions has been challenged. I further understand that the purported basis of said challenge is that the city indicated next to my name was abbreviated as "WP" rather than "White Plains." I learned this information on the evening of August 9, 2017. I received no such notification from the Board of Elections, nor do I have any remedy before that body.
- 6. I submit this sworn affidavit to demonstrate that I am, in fact, a resident of the City of White Plains, and a registered Democratic voter of the City of White Plains. Indeed, I am an appointed official of the City of White Plains. Such appointments came by Mayor Thomas M. Roach and/or members of the City of White Plains Common Council, including one or more parties in the instant action.
- 7. I object to the challenge and potential disqualification of my signature based on the use of the abbreviation "WP" rather than "White Plains," in view of the fact that the nominating petitions at issue repeatedly mention the City of White Plains and are for elected positions in the City of White Plains only (not for some statewide office where, unlike here, the abbreviation "WP" could theoretically be misconstrued as referring to another city or town).
- 8. The other intervenors and I (collectively, the "Intervenors") seek to intervene in this action pursuant to NY CPLR §§ 1012 and 1013. Specifically, we seek to intervene as of right

pursuant to NY CPLR § 1012 because the representation of our interests by the parties in the above-captioned action is or may be inadequate and we may be bound and our rights infringed by any judgment in the above-captioned action. Alternatively, we seek to intervene with the Court's permission pursuant to NY CPLR § 1013 because our claims share a common question or law or fact with the instant action.

- 9. Our efforts to intervene are timely under the circumstances and need not cause any material delay, and I do not believe that intervention will prejudice the rights of any party.
- 10. Attached hereto as Exhibit B is the Intervenor's proposed Verified Petition.

11. No prior application for the relief requested herein has been made.

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Petitioners Mark M. Elliott and Alexis G. Heidenberg, by their attorneys Phillips Nizer LLP, on behalf of themselves and all other similarly situated registered voters, allege as follows:

- 1. Petitioner-Aggrieved Voter Mark M. Elliott, is a long-time resident of the City of White Plains, County of Westchester, State of New York. Mr. Elliott resides at 2 Arborwood Lane, White Plains, New York 10603. Mr. Elliott is currently the Chair of the City of White Plains Board of Ethics and a member of the City of White Plains Judicial Screening Committee.
- 2. Petitioner-Aggrieved Voter Alexis G. Heidenberg, is a long-time resident of the City of White Plains, County of Westchester, State of New York. Ms. Heidenberg resides at 121 North Broadway, Apt. 41-B, White Plains, New York 10603. Ms. Heidenberg's father, the Honorable Robert Greer, was the Chair of the City of White Plains Democratic Committee for many years and was a member of the City of White Plaints Common Council.

- 3. Petitioners herein are registered Democratic Party voters, registered to vote in Westchester County.
- 4. Respondent Board of Elections is charged with the responsibility of the supervision of the conduct of official elections held in the County of Westchester, including the duties of receiving and filing designating petitions for public office in political subdivisions located entirely within the County of Westchester, the review and determination of Objections and Specifications of Objections to such designating petitions, notification of a determination of noncompliance, maintaining the permanent personal voter registration poll records of voters and official maps for all election districts located within the County of Westchester, and the preparation of official Primary, General and Special Election ballots for use in the County of Westchester and the City of White Plains.
- 5. The City of White Plains is a political subdivision located entirely within the County of Westchester.
- 6. Petitioners duly signed Democratic Party Designating Petition Sheets designating Milagros Lecuona, Michael Kraver, Saad Turab Siddiqui, and Alan D. Goldman as candidates for the offices of Mayor of the City of White Plains and Members of the Common Council of the City of White Plains, respectively, and provided all other requisite information.
- 7. Upon information and belief, the signatures of Petitioners herein have been challenged for the purpose of invalidating them before the Board of Elections and/or are the subject of legal proceedings before this Court. The purported basis for this challenge is that the

city listed next to Petitioners' names was abbreviated as "WP" rather than "White Plains."

- 8. Petitioners learned this information on August 9, 2017. Petitioners received no notification from the Board of Elections regarding this, nor do they have any remedy before that body.
- 9. Petitioners meet all requirements to be, and are, in fact, registered Democratic Party voters in the City of White Plains, County of Westchester. They have been injured by the foregoing.

CLASS ACTION

- 10. The putative class is so numerous that joinder of all members is impracticable.
- 11. The questions of law and/or fact that are common to the class predominate over any questions affecting only individual members.
- 12. The claims of the representative parties are typical of the claims of the class.
- 13. The representative parties will fairly and adequately protect the interests of the class.
- 14. A class action is superior to other available methods for the fair and efficient adjudication of the controversy.

AS AND FOR A FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

15. Petitioners incorporate and reallege the information contained in paragraphs 1 - 14 above as if fully set forth herein.

16. Such challenge and efforts to invalidate their signatures on nominating petitions does not comply with New York Election Law § 6-134(5) relating to designating petitions, which specifically states that "[t]he use of customary abbreviations of addresses of such signers or witnesses[] shall not invalidate such signatures or witness statement provided that the identity of the signer or witness as a registered voter can be established by reference to the signature on the petition and that of a person whose name appears in the registration poll ledgers."

AS AND FOR A SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

- 17. Petitioners incorporate and reallege the information contained in paragraphs 1 16 above as if fully set forth herein.
- 18. Such challenge to and potential disqualification of Petitioners' signatures have the practical effect of disenfranchising them as eligible Westchester County voters, in violation of their rights under the First Amendment of the United States Constitution, specifically Petitioners' rights to free speech and free association. The foregoing acts also violate the free speech provisions of the New York State Constitution.

AS AND FOR A THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION

- 19. Petitioners incorporate and reallege the information contained in paragraphs 1 18 above as if fully set forth herein.
- Such challenge to and potential disqualification of Petitioners' signatures have the practical effect of disenfranchising them as eligible Westchester County voters, in violation of their rights under the Fourteenth Amendment of the United States

Constitution, specifically Petitioners' rights to due process and equal protection under the law.

WHEREFORE, Petitioners demand that (i) Respondent be barred from challenging, invalidating, or disqualifying Petitioners' signatures on any nominating petitions on the basis that the city listed next to their names was abbreviated as "WP" rather than "White Plains," and (ii) the signatures on the foregoing petitions of Petitioners and all similarly situated registered voters be accepted for all purposes under applicable law as valid.
